Minutes Berrysburg Borough Council June 9, 2025

A motion to pay the borough bills that were read was made by Dakoda Hoch-Weiss, second by Herb Mauser, all in favor.

A motion to adjourn was made by Kent Zimmerman, second by Dakoda Hoch-Weiss, all in favor.
